

## Options for Content Sharing between LMS's

### Option 1: LTI

| What is it?       | Learning Tools Interoperability (LTI) is a way of integrating learning applications (tools) with learning management systems.   |
| How does it work? | We publish our content, either whole courses or individual learning activities as LTI tools. We send you a set of unique LTI "keys" or URLs that you use to access our content from your LMS. Your users access the content from within your LMS, but their completion data is visible to both LMS's. Other user profile data is also shared with us, depending on the settings you select. |

### Option 2: SCORM Remote

| What is it?       | This is a Moodle plug-in that allows sharing of SCORM packages (not whole courses) with other LMS's. SCORM packages are a method of content creation that contain all the information the LMS needs to import and launch the content.   |
| How does it work? | We generate a "thin wrapper SCORM" which we send to you as a zip file and you upload this into your LMS as if it was a regular SCORM package. The SCORM is embedded using an inline frame (iFrame) and allows for your user enrolments and SCORM package progress (activity occurring in your LMS) to be shared with our LMS. |

| <b>Disadvantages</b> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Not all LMS's support LTI</li> <li>Requires your LMS to have the necessary plug-ins to support LTI</li> </ul>                        | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Requires you to upload our individual SCORM wrapper files into your courses (time consuming)</li> </ul>   | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>We cannot see your whole user profiles to assist your users with issues navigating our content</li> </ul>   |
